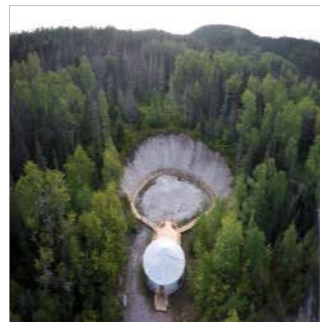
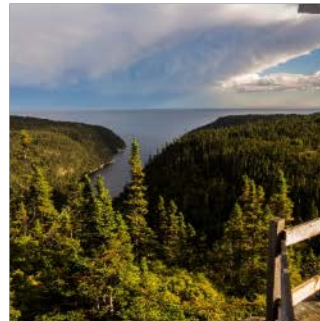

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## GENERAL OVERVIEW

Baie-Comeau is part of the UNESCO Manicouagan-Uapishka World Biosphere Reserve, one of the largest biospheres in the world.

Surrounded by water, locals and tourists can enjoy parks, walking trails and easy access to numerous beaches. From unleashing your inner scientist at the famous Glaciers' Garden or Seashell Valley to experiencing life as a lumberjack at the notorious Franquelin Heritage Forest Village, Baie-Comeau has something for everyone.

Admire magnificent frescoes inside the beautiful Church of St. Amelie, learn the fascinating history of Colonel McCormick at Manoir Baie-Comeau,

and witness one of Québec's greatest feats of engineering at the hydroelectric dams.

Baie-Comeau's culture, architecture, and heritage are prominent in its downtown, where panels and murals herald its history. Important landmarks are interspersed with interesting boutiques and colourful art galleries.

Most impressive of all is the warm, welcoming nature of Baie-Comeau's residents which ensure visitors a truly memorable stay.

### Taxes

PST – The provincial sales tax of 9.975 % is no longer refundable.

GST – A federal sales tax of 5.0 %

### Denominations

Notes (\$5, \$10, \$20, \$50, \$100) and coins (5¢, 10¢, 25¢, \$1 and \$2).

### Exchange rate

The approximate rate of exchange is \$1.00 USD = \$1.30 CDN.

For the exact exchange rate of the day, please consult the information desk aboard your vessel.

### Other acceptable currencies

The US dollar is occasionally accepted. However, it is strongly recommended that tourists change US dollars to Canadian dollars at a proper exchange bureau or bank. If using US dollars in shops, restaurants or for taxis, the exchange rate will not be beneficial to you. Paying by credit card is always a good option, as you will then receive the best exchange rate of the day. Currencies aside from the Canadian and US dollar are not accepted.

In the summer, lightweight clothes are advisable during the day. However, evenings can be cool. In autumn, weather can change throughout the day, so guests are advised to always dress in layers. In winter, rainfall average represents snowfall.

The Ice Experience Center takes visitors on a journey through geological time to observe the evolution of the planet during the last ice age. Through a high-tech multimedia experience, they relive the spawning of the largest glaciers in the world, the formation of post-glacial seas, and the migration of the first humans to North America. They may then become visitor-explorers, embarking on one of the guided tour scenarios to explore the vestiges of the last ice age in the Maritime Glacier Garden, a unique 15 square-mile territory.

The first microbrewery on the North Shore offers local flavoured beers brewed on site. Learn about the conception of the beers and the history of the microbrewery. Although it has no meaning clearly

established, the name of the St. Pancrace bay appears for the first time on a map in 1731. According to court records, the St. Pancrace area served the bootleggers during the alcohol prohibition. You will pass through 6 interpretation units that will let you know how St. Pancrace beer is produced and why it is different from others. Discover local products and at the very end of the tour taste different St. Pancrace beers.

Manic-2 Hydroelectric Facilities

Manic-2 is an important hollow-joint gravity dam and the first one to be put in service at the Manic-Outardes complex. Visitors tour a reception building, Georges-D'or Pavilion, which holds an actual turbine, an exhibit hall, and a multimedia room that explains the construction and operation of the dam. There is then a guided tour in the heart of Manic-2 and a visit to one of the station's powerful generators.

Manic-5 Hydroelectric Facilities

214 kilometers north of Baie-Comeau is the imposing Manic-5 dam, a multiple arch and buttress structure that is 1.3 km long and soars to a height of 214 metres. It is an architectural and engineering marvel, and one of the world's most spectacular dams. Visitors enjoy a guided visit of this amazing structure from its underground station to the panoramic views afforded from the top of the dam. Manic-5 may be reached by vehicle, seaplane, helicopter, or small plane.



Village forestier d'antan (lumberjack village)

The forest industry was crucial to the development of the North Shore. Activities such as cutting, hauling, driving, and other aspects of life in the forest are presented at this interpretation center. Typical buildings, period objects, and old photographs illustrate lumberjacks' living conditions and way of life in this period.

Built on a rocky point at the mouth of the Gulf of the St. Lawrence, the Pointe-des-Monts lighthouse is testament to a time when navigating this river was often a dangerous challenge. Visitors find exhibits on all seven floors of the lighthouse: furniture, interpretive panels, photos illustrating the living conditions of the guardians, and stories of shipwrecks and the survivors who sometimes had to stay here throughout the entire winter.

Godbout Birds of Prey Interpretation Center

The Godbout Birds of Prey Interpretation Center is a refuge for birds of prey with a permanent disability and can not be released. Observe the refugees in ten interpretation aviaries, set up in a natural environment; the closest you'll ever get to a bird of prey! A trail will take you there, allowing you to discover native plant species from the region as well.

Visit an Innu interpretation center with Mr. Wabush who explains you more about hunting, fishing, trapping and traditional food.
